- 3. "Lonesome Dove" by Larry McMurtry It was reported that astronaut Ron Garan took this Pulitzer Prize-winning western novel to space.

- 9. "The Andromeda Strain" by Michael Crichton Taken by astronaut Jeffrey Williams to the International Space Station.
- 10. "The Hunt for Red October" by Tom Clancy Taken by astronaut Michael Foale to the Russian space station Mir in 1997.
